PREPARING YOUR TREES AND SHRUBS FOR WINTER By Kathi Carr

The next 5 months can be brutal on our outdoor plants. There are a some items that you can do to protect your shrubs and trees from the harsh winter weather. Make sure to water your evergreens well this fall. Several deep waterings will help to supply them with adequate water over the winter. Unlike shade trees, evergreens continue to lose water through their needles through out the winter.

Adding several inches of hard-wood mulch will help to insulate the roots from the freezing and thawing of the ground. Consider putting mulch around all of your trees, shrubs and perennials. Rabbits and deer do a tremendous amount of damage to plants in the winter. Inspect for animal damage through out the winter. You may want to use a chemical or physical barrier if you notice damage. If you live in an area

where there are deer, protect the bark of young shade trees. We use corrugated plastic drainage tile. We slit the side and put it around the trees. Professional tree wrap is also available.

Be conscientious of where you put the snow this winter. Do not pile it near shrubs. Also be very conservative with the amount of salt that you use. Salt does a tremendous amount of damage to plants each winter.

Apple Peanut Butter Crisp Ingredients:

5 large apples, peeled, cored and sliced

1/3-cup water

1/4 tsp. allspice

1/2-cup flour

1/3-cup sugar

2 Tbs. margarine

1 Tbs. lemon juice

1/2 tsp. nutmeg

3/4 cup rolled oats

1/3-cup peanut butter
Put apple slices in a 9x13-inch pan.
Pour water, lemon juice and spices on apples, and then blend rest of ingredients and spread on apples. Bake at 325 degrees for 40 minutes.

Our fall flowering mums (Chrysanthemums) are here. Yellow, bronze/orange, purple, red and white mums are available. The plants are very full. Some are literally covered with hundreds of buds. They are flowering now and will continue to flower well into the fall. They are \$6.95 each or 3 for \$19.00 and are in 9" x 6" mum pans.

Kale and Cabbage will also be available. The inner leaves or head of the cabbage and kale will dramatically change color with the coolness of fall. It is often quite ornamental until Christmas. They are \$6.00 for 8" containers.


