

Plants for all Seasons

The following is a list of plants that have an attribute that looks good in a particular season.

Fall:

Compact Amur Maple-Absolutely beautiful red fall color

Tiger Eyes Cut leaf Sumac-Golden Yellow leaves followed by bright red fall color

Gro-Low Fragrant Sumac-As the name implies, a great low plant that packs a punch with fiery red leaves in the fall.

Sunshine Blue Bluebeard-A shrub that has great yellow foliage in the summer and gorgeous, true blue flowers in the fall. Very unique.

Pagoda Dogwood-Interesting specimen tree with yellow flowers in spring and a maroon fall color.

Winter:

Contorted Filber-Extremely interesting branches that grow in a curly Q pattern

Emerald N Gold Euonymus-

*Sweet and Smiling are your ways...
Beautiful, Golden, Autumn Days.*



Yellow and green soft broad leaves that stay on through out the winter

Dwarf Alberta Spruce-Perfect little Christmas tree type plants. They provide a great structure for decorating with lights.

Spring:

Birch leaf Spirea-A unique, compact spirea with round leaves and delicate white flowers.

Golden Glory Dogwood-Yellow flowers followed by red berries.

Summer:

Summer Glow Tamarisk- Rosy flower spikes for a long period of time. Feathery, evergreen appearance

Canada Red Cherry-tree with deep purple leaves throughout the summer and fall

Butterfly Bush-Pink, purple or white flowers that will live up to it's name!

Road Construction Update

The McHenry County Division of Transportation is nearing completion of their Harmony Road improvement project. The road has a paved subsurface and grading of the shoulders is occurring this week. The final paving should be done soon, weather permitting. While we have not heard when Harmony Road, East of Route 20 will be re-open to traffic, we think (hope) it will be sooner rather than later. Ingredients

1/2 c. Shortening
3/4 c. Sugar
3/4 c. Brown Sugar
2 Eggs
1 tsp. Baking soda
1 tsp. Baking Powder
2 cups Apples-Peeled and thinly sliced
1/2 c. Water
1/2 c. Semi-sweet Chocolate chips
1/2 c. Walnuts-chopped

Topping: 1/2 c. Brown Sugar, 1/2 c. Chopped Walnuts, 1/2 c. Chocolate. Chips
Cream together shortening and sugars. Add eggs and beat thoroughly. Sift together dry ingredients. Add dry ingredients to creamed mixture alternating with water. Beat until smooth Coat apples lightly with flour. Fold apples and 1/2 c. each of chocolate chips & walnuts. Turn out into greased & floured 9x13x2 pan. Sprinkle topping mixture on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 50 minutes.
